Re: Your Tacit Admission That I Am Wrongly Convicted


Dear Mr. Lipske,

On August 19, 2005, I sent you a letter briefly highlighting certain facts demonstrating that you clearly are aware I am wrongly convicted. I also did advise you the letter would appear on the internet and that the many Iron County visitors to the website would be awaiting your response. In the last paragraph of that letter I stated, "*The concerned citizens of Iron County await your response on each and every issue, sir. **No reply indicates you do not deny one word written here.***"

You received that letter several weeks ago but have not responded. Failure to respond is affirmation that you, appropriately, do not deny the fact that I am wrongly convicted, and such is also your tacit admission that I am suffering a wrongful conviction.

This letter will also appear on the website dedicated to the injustices in my case. Because you now tacitly admit this to be a wrongful conviction, please take the immediate and necessary steps to reverse the convictions. Further, I also urge that you justly hold the false accuser responsible for having filed false police reports, obstructed justice, and for committing multiple counts of proven perjury. Please act promptly to reverse the convictions, Mr. Lipske. Thank you very much.
